
Investment Objective

The investment objective of the ETF is to seek to replicate the performance of the S&P/TSX 60 Equal Weight Index, net of expenses. The S&P/TSX 60 Equal Weight Index is an equal weight diversified index of the constituent issuers in the S&P/TSX 60™ Index.

Key Investment Strategies

To achieve the ETF's investment objectives, the ETF invests and holds the equity securities of the constituent issuers in the S&P/TSX 60™ Index in substantially the same proportion as the S&P/TSX 60 Equal Weight Index. The ETF is fully invested in or exposed to the markets at all times. The ETF may employ a "stratified sampling" strategy. Under this stratified sampling strategy, the ETF may not hold all of the securities that are included in the S&P/TSX 60 Equal Weight Index, but instead would hold a portfolio of securities that closely matches the aggregate investment characteristics of the securities included in the S&P/TSX 60 Equal Weight Index.

Risk

Statement of Rights

Other Fees

The Manager of the ETF, may, at its discretion, charge dealers redeeming a prescribed number of units of the ETF a redemption charge of up to 0.25% of the redemption proceeds. The Manager will publish the current redemption charge, if any, on its website, www.horizonsetfs.com.

A redemption charge will not be charged to a unitholder selling units of the ETF on the TSX. You may pay brokerage fees to your dealer when you purchase and sell units of the ETF.

The Plus ETFs and certain other Horizons Exchange Traded Products use leveraged investment techniques that magnify gains and losses and result in greater volatility in value. These Horizons Exchange Traded Products are subject to leverage risk and may be subject to aggressive investment risk and price volatility risk, which, where applicable, are described in their respective prospectuses. Each Plus ETF seeks a return, before fees and expenses, that is either 200% or -200% of the performance of a specified underlying index, commodity or benchmark (the "Target") for a single day. Each Index ETF or Inverse ETF seeks a return that is 100% or - 100%, respectively, of the performance of a Target. Due to the compounding of daily returns, a Plus ETF's or Inverse ETF's returns over periods other than one day will likely differ in amount and possibly direction from the performance of their respective Target(s) for the same period. The Horizons Exchange Traded Products whose Target is the S&P 500 VIX Short-Term Futures Index(tm) (the "VIX ETFs"), one of which is a Plus ETF, one of which is an Inverse ETF, and one of which is an Index ETF, as described in their prospectus, are speculative investment tools that are not conventional investments. The VIX ETFs' Target is highly volatile. As a result, the VIX ETFs are not generally viewed as stand-alone long-term investments. Historically, the VIX ETFs' Target has tended to revert to a historical mean. As a result, the performance of the VIX ETFs' Target is expected to be negative over the longer term and neither the VIX ETFs nor their Target are expected to have positive long term performance. Investors should monitor their holdings, as frequently as daily, to ensure that they remain consistent with their investment strategies.

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
